


(The choir repeat the above verse as the faithful make their way to the outside of the church).

Priest: For You, our God, are Holy, and to You we ascribe glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

Priest: (Quietly) Holy God, resting among the holy, Who with the Thrice-Holy hymn are praised by the Seraphim, glorified by the Cherubim and worshipped by every Heavenly Power; Who brought all things from non-being into being; Who created humanity in Your image and likeness, and adorned him with Your every gift; Who gave wisdom and understanding to those who ask, and do not overlook the sinner, but have established repentance for salvation; Who have made us worthy, Your lowly and unworthy servants, worthy to stand at this hour before the glory of Your holy altar and offer the worship and praise due to You: accept, Master, the Thrice-Holy hymn even from the mouth of us sinners, and visit us in Your goodness. Forgive us every offence, both voluntary and involuntary. Sanctify our souls and bodies, and grant that we may worship You in holiness all the days of our life: through the intercessions of the holy Theotokos and all the Saints who in every age have been pleasing to You: for You, our God, are Holy, and to You we offer glory: to the Father, and to

the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen.

The Baptismal Hymn

People: As many of you as were baptised into Christ have put on Christ. Alleluia. (x3)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now, and forever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Have put on Christ. Alleluia.

Priest: Dhynamis!

People: As many of you as were baptised into Christ have put on Christ. Alleluia.

The Epistle Reading

Priest: Let us attend.

Reader: This is the Day the Lord has made; We will rejoice and be glad in it.

Priest: Wisdom.

Reader: The reading from the Acts of the holy Apostles. (Chapter 1:1-8)

Priest: Let us attend!

Reader: The former account I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach, until the day in which He was taken up, after He through the Holy Spirit had given commandments to the Apostles whom He had chosen, to whom He also presented Himself alive after His suffering by many infallible proofs, being seen by them during forty days and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God. And being assembled together with them, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, "which," He said, "you have heard from Me; for John truly baptised with water, but you shall be baptised with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." Therefore, when they had come together, they asked Him, saying, "Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" And He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the Earth."

Priest: Peace be to you reader.

People: Alleluia. Alleluia. Alleluia.

Prayer before the Gospel

Priest: Master, lover of mankind, make the pure light of Your divine knowledge, shine in our hearts and open the eyes of our mind to the understanding the message of Your Gospel. Implant in us the fear of Your blessed commandments, so that, having trampled down all earthly desires, we may change to a spiritual way of life, thinking and doing all things that are to You. For You give light to our souls and bodies, Christ our God, and to You we ascribe Glory, together with Your Father who is without beginning and Your all-Holy, Good and Life-giving Spirit, now and forever, and to ages of ages. Amen.

The Gospel Lesson

Priest: Wisdom. Let us attend and hear the Holy Gospel.

Priest: Peace be to you all.

People: And to your spirit.

Priest: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint John.

(Chapter 1:1-17)

People: Glory to You, O Lord, glory to You.

Priest: Let us attend.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. This man came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all through him might believe. He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light. That was the true Light which gives light to every man coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him. He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him. But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His Name: who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the Only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth. John bore witness of Him and cried out, saying, "This was He of Whom I said, 'He Who comes after me is preferred before me, for He was before

me.' " And of His fullness we have all received, and grace for grace. For the law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

People: Glory to You, O Lord, glory to You.

(The people may be seated for the sermon.)

The Litany

Priest: Again, and again, in peace let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord have mercy.

Priest: Help us, save us, have mercy on us, and keep us, O God, by Your grace.

People: Lord have mercy.

Priest: Wisdom.

Priest: Again and many times we fall down before You and beseech You, Who are Good and the lover of mankind, that heading our prayer you will cleanse our souls and bodies from every defilement of flesh or spirit; and will grant us to stand without guilt or condemnation before Your holy Altar. Give also to those who pray with us the grace of progress in right living, in faith and spiritual understanding. Grant that always worshiping You with fear and love, they may partake of Your Holy Mysteries without guilt or condemnation, and to be accounted worthy of Your Heavenly Kingdom:

Priest: That always guarded by Your might, we may ascribe to You glory; to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit now and forever and to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

The Cherubic Hymn

People: Let us who mystically represent the Cherubim, and who sing the thrice holy hymn to the Life-giving Trinity, now lay aside all earthly cares, that we may receive the King of all.

(Repeat the Cherubic Hymn until the priest is ready for the Great Entrance.)

Priest: None of those who are entangled in earthly desires and pleasures of the flesh is worthy to approach or draw near or minister to You, King of Glory, for to serve You, is a great and awesome even for the heavenly powers, Yet on account of Your inexpressible and boundless love for mankind You became man, without change or alteration, and were named our High Priest, and as Master of all You have delivered to us the sacred ministry of this sacramental sacrifice without the shedding of blood. For You alone, Lord our God, are Ruler over all thing in heaven and on earth; mounted on the throne of the Cherubim; Lord of the Seraphim and King of Israel; the only holy One resting in the holy place. Therefore, I entreat You who alone are good and ready to hear: Look upon me, Your sinful, and unprofitable servant, and purify my soul and my heart from an evil conscience. By the power of Your Holy Spirit enable me, clothed with the grace of the priesthood, to stand at Your Holy table, and celebrate the mystery of Your holy and most Pure Body and Precious Blood. For to You I come bowing my head and praying: Do not turn away Your face from me, nor reject me from among Your children; but count me, Your sinful and unworthy servant, worthy to offer these Gifts to You. For You are the One Who offers and is offered, Who

receives and is distributed, O Christ our God: and to You we ascribe glory, together with Your Father who is without beginning, and Your all-holy, good and life-giving Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Let us who mystically represent the Cherubim, and who sing the thrice holy hymn to the Life-giving Trinity, now lay aside all earthly cares, that we may receive the King of all.

Who comes invisibly borne aloft by the angelic hosts. Alleluia. Alleluia. Alleluia.

You were in the tomb in the body; and in hell in the spirit because You are God, and in paradise with the thief, yet on the throne with the Father and the Spirit, O Christ, present everywhere filling the universe.

Glory to the Father and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Your life-giving tomb, O Christ, is revealed to us, more radiant than paradise, lovelier by far than any royal chamber, the source of our resurrection.

Now and forever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Rejoice, You Who are made holy to be a dwelling for the Most High, for through you, O Master of God, make joy to those who cry out; Blessed are you among women, most holy lady.

Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death, and upon those in the tombs bestowing life. (x3)

<u>Psalm 50</u>

Priest: (Quietly) Have mercy upon me, O God, according to Your lovingkindness; According to the multitude of Your tender mercies, blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity and

cleanse me from my sin. For I acknowledge my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. Against You, You only, have I sinned, and done this evil in Your sight that You may be found just when You speak, and blameless when You judge.

Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin my mother conceived me. Behold, You desire truth in the inward parts, and in the hidden part You will make me to know wisdom. Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; Wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. Make me hear joy and gladness, that the bones You have broken may rejoice. Hide Your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquities.

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from Your presence, and do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. Deliver me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, The God of my salvation, and my tongue shall sing aloud of Your righteousness. O Lord open my lips, and my mouth shall show forth Your praise. For You do not desire sacrifice, or else I would give it; You do not delight in burnt offering. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit, a broken and a contrite heart These, O God, You will not despise. Do good in Your good pleasure to Zion; Build the walls of Jerusalem. Then You shall be pleased with the sacrifices of righteousness, with burnt offering and whole burnt offering;

Priest: All of you and all Orthodox Christians may the Lord our God remember in His heavenly Kingdom at all times, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

Priest: Our Father Metropolitan (Name), may the Lord God remember in His heavenly Kingdom at all times, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

Priest: The servants of God, offer this Holy Oblation (*Names*), that they may have mercy, life, peace, health, salvation, visitation, pardon and remission of their sins, may the Lord God remember in His kingdom at all times, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

Priest: The servants of God departed this life, for whom we offer this Holy Oblation (*Names*), for the repose of their souls and remission of their sins, may the Lord God remember in His kingdom at all times, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

Who comes invisibly borne aloft by the angelic hosts. Alleluia. Alleluia. Alleluia.

Priest: then shall they offer bulls upon Your Altar.

The Litany of Supplication

Priest: Let us complete our prayer unto the Lord.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Priest: For the precious Gifts here presented, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Priest: For this holy House, and for those who enter it with faith, reverence and the fear of God, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Priest: For our deliverance from all affliction, wrath, danger and necessity, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Priest: Help us, save us, have mercy on us, and keep us, O God, by Your grace.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Priest: That the whole day may be perfect, holy, peaceful, and without sin, let us ask of the Lord.

People: Grant this, O Lord.

Priest: An angel of peace, a faithful guide, a guardian of our souls and bodies, let us ask of the Lord.

People: Grant this, O Lord.

Priest: Pardon and forgiveness of our sins and offenses, let us ask of the Lord.

People: Grant this, O Lord.

Priest: All things good and profitable for our souls, and peace for the world, let us ask of the Lord.

People: Grant this, O Lord.

Priest: That we may complete the remaining time of our life in peace and repentance, let us ask of the Lord.

People: Grant this, O Lord.

Priest: A Christian ending to our life, painless, blameless, peaceful; and a good defence before the dread Judgment seat of Christ, let us ask of the Lord.

People: Grant this, O Lord.

Priest: Commemorating our all-holy, pure, most blessed and glorious Lady, the Theotokos and Ever Virgin Mary, (Most Holy Theotokos, save us) with all the saints; let us entrust ourselves and one another, and our whole life, to Christ our God.

People: To You, O Lord.

Priest: Lord God Almighty, You alone are holy, You accept a sacrifice of praise from those who call upon You with all their heart: accept also the supplication of us sinners, bring us to Your Holy Altar, and enable us to offer You Gifts and spiritual sacrifices for our sins and for those committed in ignorance by Your people. Count us worthy to find grace in Your sight, that our sacrifice may be well pleasing to You and that the good Spirit of Your grace may rest on us and on these Gifts here set forth and on all Your people:

Priest: Through the tender mercies of Your Only-begotten Son, with Whom You are blessed, together with Your All-Holy gracious and Life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

The Peace

Priest: Peace be to you all.

People: And to your spirit.

Priest: Let us love another, that with one mind we may confess:

People: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit: the Trinity, one in essence and

undivided.

Priest: The doors. The doors with wisdom let us give heed.

The Creed

All: I believe in one God, Father, Almighty, Maker of Heaven and Earth, and of all things, visible and invisible.

And in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the Only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all ages, Light from Light; True God from True God; begotten, not made; of one in essence with the Father; through Him all things were made.

Who for us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became man. And He was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate and suffered, and was buried.

And He rose on the third day, according to the Scriptures. And ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father;

And will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end.

And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of Life, Who proceeds from the Father, Who together with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, Who spoke through the prophets.

And in one holy, catholic, and Apostolic Church. I confess one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the age to come. Amen.

The Eucharistic Prayer

Priest: Let us stand aright. Let us stand with fear. Let us listen with care, that we may offer the holy Oblation in peace.

People: Mercy and peace, a sacrifice of praise.

Priest: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

People: And with your spirit.

Priest: Let us lift up our hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord.

People: It is right and just to worship Father, Son, and Holy Spirit: The Trinity, one in essence and undivided.

Priest: (Quietly) It is right and just to hymn You, to bless You, to praise You, to worship You, and to give You thanks, in every place of Your dominion; for You are God, unutterable, inconceivable,

invisible, incomprehensible, ever-living and forever the same; You and Your Only-begotten Son and Your Holy Spirit. It was You that brought us from non-being into being and when we had fallen away You raised us again, and did not cease to do all things till You had led us up to Heaven, and had endowed us with Your kingdom which is to come. For all this we give You thanks, You and Your Only-begotten Son, and Your Holy Spirit: for all those things of which we know or do not know, and for the benefits bestowed on us, seen or unseen. And we thank You for this liturgy which You are pleased to accept at our hands, though there stand before You thousands of Archangels and myriads of Angels, the Cherubim and the Seraphim, six-winged, many-eyed, who soar aloft upon their wings:

Priest: Singing the triumphal hymn, shouting, proclaiming, and crying aloud:

People: Holy, Holy, Lord of Sabaoth. Heaven and Earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is He Who comes in the Name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

Priest: (Quietly) Together with these blessed Powers, O Master and Lover of mankind, we also cry aloud and say: Holy are You and All-Holy, You and Your Only-begotten Son and Your Holy Spirit, Holy are You and All-Holy, and resplendent is Your glory. You have so loved Your world that You gave Your Only-begotten Son, so that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. When He had come and fulfilled Your whole purpose for us, in the night that He was given up - or rather, in which He gave Himself up for the life of the world - He took bread in His holy, pure and blameless hands; and when He had given thanks and blessed it, and hallowed it, and broken it, He gave it to His holy disciples and apostles, saying:

Priest: Take, eat; this is My Body which is broken for you, for the forgiveness of sins.

People: Amen.

Priest: In the same way, after supper, He took the cup, saying:

Priest: Drink from this, all of you. This is My Blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins.

People: Amen.

Priest: Remembering therefore this saving command, and all that has taken place on our account: the cross, the grave, the resurrection on the third day, the ascent into Heaven, the sitting-down at the right hand of the Father, and the second and glorious coming;

Thine own of Thine own, we offer Thee in all things and for all things.

We praise You, we bless You, we give thanks to you O Lord, and we pray to You, O our God.

Again, we offer You this reasonable and bloodless sacrifice of the Word; and we ask, and beseech, and entreat You: send down Your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts here presented;

And make this bread the precious Body of Your Christ;

People: Amen.

Priest: And this cup to be the precious Blood of our Lord and God and Saviour Jesus Christ;

People: Amen.

Priest: Changing them by Your Holy Spirit;

People: Amen. Amen. Amen.

We praise You, we bless You, we give thanks to you O Lord, and we pray to You, O our God.

Priest: (Quietly) So that to those who share in them they may be for the cleansing of the soul, for the forgiveness of sins, for the communion of Your Holy Spirit, for the fulfilment of the kingdom of Heaven, for boldness towards You; and not for an accusation or a condemnation. Again, we offer You this reasonable sacrifice of the Word, on behalf of those who have died in the faith: on behalf of our Forefathers, Fathers, Patriarchs, Prophets, Apostles, Preachers, Evangelists, Martyrs, Confessors, Ascetics, and every just spirit made perfect through faith;

Priest: And especially for our all-holy, pure, most blessed and most glorious Lady, Theotokos, and ever-Virgin Mary;

Hymn to the Theotokos (Tone 1)

People: The Angel cried to her who is full of Grace: "O pure Virgin rejoice, and again, I say: Rejoice! For your Son has risen from the grave on the third day."

Shine, shine, O New Jerusalem! For the glory of the Lord has risen upon You. Dance now and be glad, Sion; and do you exalt, O pure Theotokos, in the arising of Him, Whom you did bear.

Priest: Remember first, O Lord, our Father Metropolitan (*Name*), and keep him for your holy churches in peace, safety, honour, health, and length of days rightly proclaiming the word of Your truth.

People: Amen.

Priest: And those whom we hold in our minds and all Your people.

People: And all mankind.

Priest: And grant that with one voice and heart we may praise and glorify Your most honoured and majestic Name: the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

Priest: And the mercies of our great God and Saviour Jesus Christ be with you all.

People: And with your spirit.

The Litany

Priest: Having commemorated all the saints, again and again in peace let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord have mercy.

Priest: For the precious gifts here set forth and made holy, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord have mercy.

Priest: That our God, who Loves of mankind, having accepted them on His holy and heavenly altar on high as a fragrant spiritual offering, may send down upon us in return His divine grace and the gift of the Holy Spirit, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord have mercy.

Priest: For our deliverance from all affliction, wrath, danger and necessity, let us pray to the Lord.

Priest: Help us, save us, have mercy on us, and keep us, O God, by Your grace.

People: Lord have mercy.

Priest: Having asked for the unity of the faith, and the communion of the Holy Spirit, let us commit ourselves and each other, and our whole life, to Christ our God.

People: To You O Lord.

Priest: (Quietly) To You we commit our whole life and our hope, O Master and Lover of mankind; and we ask, and pray, and beseech You, to make us worthy to share with a pure conscience in Your heavenly and fearful mysteries at this sacred and spiritual table: for the remission of our sins, for the forgiveness of our wrongdoing, for the communion of the Holy Spirit for our inheritance of the Kingdom of Heaven, for boldness towards You; but not for an accusation or a condemnation.

Priest: And count us worthy, Master with boldness and without condemnation to dare to call upon You the God of heaven as Father, and to say:

People: Our Father Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on Earth, as it is in Heaven. Give us this day, our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.

Priest: For Yours is the kingdom, the power, and the glory of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

Priest: Peace be to you all.

People: And to your spirit.

Priest: Let us bow our heads to the Lord.

People: To You O Lord.

Priest: We thank You King invisible, Who by Your boundless power created all things in the abundance of Your mercy bringing them into being out of nothing. Look down from heaven, Master, on those who have bowed their head before You; for they have bowed, not to flesh and blood, but to You, the God before whom we stand in awe. Make smooth, then our path for our good, Master, through what lies before us, according to the need of each; sail with those who sail by sea, journey with those who travel by land and air, heal the sick, for You are the physician of our souls and bodies.

Priest: Through the grace and compassion and love towards mankind of Your Only-begotten Son, with Whom You are

blessed, together with Your All-Holy, Gracious and Life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

The Elevation

Priest: Hear us, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, from Your holy dwelling-place, from the throne of Your glorious kingdom; and come to hallow us, You that sit on high with the Father, yet are invisibly present here with us; and make us worthy by Your mighty hand, giving to us a share in Your most pure Body and Your precious Blood, and through us to all the people.

O God, be merciful to me, a sinner, and be gracious to me. (x3)

Priest: Let us attend.

Priest: Holy things for a holy people.

People: One only is Holy, One is the Lord, Jesus Christ to the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Pre-Communion Prayers

I believe, Lord, and I confess, that You are truly the Christ, the Son of the living God, Who came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the first. Also, I believe that this is truly Your most pure Body, and this is indeed Your precious Blood. Therefore I beseech You, have mercy on me and to forgive me my offences, through weakness, through ignorance or through my own deliberate fault, in word and in deed, in knowledge and in ignorance; and count me worthy to partake

uncondemned, of Your most pure Mysteries, for the forgiveness of my sins and for eternal life. Amen.

Accept me today, O Son of God, as a communicant in Your mystical supper; for I will not speak of the mystery to Your enemies, nor will I give You the kiss of Judas; but like the thief I will acknowledge You and say: Remember me, O Lord, in Your kingdom.

How can I, the unworthy one, enter into the glory of Your Saints? For should I dare to enter the bridal chamber with them, my clothing betrays me, for it is not the wedding garment; and bound I shall be cast out by the Angels. So cleanse my soul, O Lord, from the stain of sins, and save me by Your love for mankind.

Tremble, O mortal, as you look upon the Blood which makes You divine, for it is a burning coal, consuming the unworthy. The Body of God makes me divine and nourishes me. It makes the spirit divine and wondrously nourishes the mind.

You have smitten my with yearning, O Christ, and by Your divine love You have changed me. But with Your spiritual fire, consumer my sins and count me worthy to be filled with delight in You, that leaping for joy, O Good One, I may proclaim the greatness of Your two comings.

Master, Lover of mankind, Lord Jesus Christ my God, let not these Holy Mysteries be for my condemnation because of my unworthiness, but rather for the cleansing and sanctification of both soul and body, and as a pledge of the life and kingdom to come. It is good for me to cleave to God, to place in the Lord the hope of my salvation.

Clergy Communion Hymn

People: Receive the Body of Christ; and taste of the Fountain of Immortality. Alleluia.

Paschal Homily of St John Chrysostom

If any be a devout lover of God, let them partake with gladness from this fair and radiant feast.

If any be a faithful servant, let them enter rejoicing into the joy of their Lord.

If any have wearied themselves with fasting, let them now enjoy their reward.

If any have laboured from the first hour, let them receive today their rightful due. If any have come after the third, let them celebrate the feast with thankfulness. If any have come after the sixth, let them not be in doubt, for they will suffer no loss. If any have delayed until the ninth, let them not hesitate to draw near. If any have arrived only at the eleventh, let them not be afraid because they come so late. For the Master is generous and accepts the last even as the first. He gives rest to him who comes at the eleventh hour in the same way as to him who laboured from the first. He accepts the deed, and commends the intention.

Enter all of you, into the joy of our Lord. First and last, receive a like reward. Rich and poor, dance together. You who have fasted and you who have not fasted, rejoice today. The table is fully laden: let all enjoy it. The calf is fatted: let none go away hungry.
